

- The Silent Auction will have well over 300 items and the Raffle and Games will have one of our largest selection of firearms ever.



## 1 - 3 pheasants

## Pheasant A' La Crème

- because I prefer breasts only
- If you have them breasted like we did do use three to four pheasants 1 1/2 cups of seasoned flour (add salt & pepper) 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 1/2 cup of chicken stock

- 1 2 (1 large one works) minced shallots 1 1/2 pints of heavy cream 1/3 cup creamed sherry •
- 1/3 cup dry white wine
- 1 tsp salt
- Yes, alcohol. It isn't much and it cooks off so don't worry, it makes the flavor. Yes, alcohol. It isn't much and 't cooks off so don't worry, it makes the flavor. Salt & pepper to taste

- Roll pheasant in flour & brown in skillet in hot oil. Drain.

Place pheasant in casserole dish. Add Chicken stock and shallots. Cover & bake at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours. Add the cream, creamed sherry and dry white wine and teaspoon of salt. Continue baking until pheasant is tender and sauce is thick, about 1 hour to 1 1/2 hours. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Serve over a wild rice and white rice mixture or noodles. Both are good in my opinion but if I had to choose, do the rice.



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## Childhood Dreams

As a child, I took any opportunity I could get to look at my grandpa's old issues of *Field & Stream*<sup>TM</sup>. I viewed them as if they were the gospel of how life should be; horses, guns, snow, cold, and hunting something out of a tent or backwoods cabin.

Images of long-bearded men riding or leading a horse down a mountain with a rack from an elk or mule deer on the back of a packhorse were seared into my memory. You could feel their pride as well as the pain and agony from their hunting adventure. The long nights of darkness, wolves, bears, hunger, cold, and just overall loneliness all for that one opportunity at an animal that then would have to actually be packed out.

When I met my wife Kate, I started her watching outdoor survival shows and tried to explain what being alone in the wilderness was like. But, you can't get the true feeling from a TV show. It is not something that can be explained, it has to be felt. There lies an allure for men and women alike for this feeling. I was craving this feeling, the backcountry was calling. Kate has been hearing my calling for the mountain backcountry for a while but did not understand it fully until, she, herself was in the mountains on a youth ministry trip during the summer of 2022. Something struck her while there and she understood me a little bit more. Add a random coffee chat with Bob, a retired builder who is father to two fire jumpers, one morning at the camp and she began to understand even more.

Bob and Kate chatted about life, kids, and somehow elk hunting. His eyes sparkled when she said, "My husband has been bugging me about getting out to mountains elk hunting" to which Bob knew a guy named Bob that had a camp in the backcountry. I had not talked to Kate while she was gone all week at camp but I received a text of three lines: "Elk Hunting" "Call Bob XXX-XXX-XXX" "Northpark Outfitters – Go"

I felt that if there was ever a sign, this was it...so I called. I talked with Jim instead of Bob (co-owners) and he asked me questions and vice-versa. We talked a long time about how the camp has been running for over 100 years. Jim and Bob have had it for over 40 of those years. They have horses and I meet



them at a trailhead, and we go in via horse to a tent camp. It was literally the Field and Streams hunt of my childhood that I was longing for, so I booked it. Let the training begin, walking, running, etc. I knew that if I was going to keep up I need some legs under me.

September 10 came fast and here I was meeting Carson at the trailhead a bit past noon. It had snowed and was cold. We fed the horses and I helped pack eggs, flour, and other camp necessities. There was an appaloosa saddled up and ready for me to hop on and ride back the 6-hours to the backcountry camp. For the record that is a long ride if it's been a decade since you've been on a horse. We would stop at various streams to water the horses as we navigated back up into camp at dark where we were greeted by two other hunters and Bob and Jim in person. "Tony? Hop down off that horse, we got soup on so come get something to eat and relax a bit."

Soup and food were great for the eight plus days I was in camp. After dinner I got myself settled in my canvas wall tent. I had a cot with a foam pad to lay on and a tiny, very old stove in

the corner to knock the cold edge off in the morning as I crawled out of my sleeping bag. Mornings were cold, the first night was 17 degrees, windy and more snow fell. I was so glad to have my cold war era US Army issue Extreme Cold Weather mummy bag. Without this little gem given to me by my dad, a US Army vet of 40'ish years, I would have frozen to death.


I also got acquainted with "The Frank" which was a tent a hundred yards away with a hole in the ground for camp use. It was given the name "Frank" by one of the gentlemen named, Frank. He spends a month in camp each year and has for the 40 years Bob and Jim have run it. One particular year, he got giardia from the water. You see, the water is piped in from a stream that is used by the beavers on occasion which puts us at risk for catching sickness on occasion. That one particular year was quite bad.

I did not get giardia, but I did end up with a mild case of altitude sickness. The camp was at 8600' and we climbed up and over and up and over stuff each day that was over 10,000' and sometimes over 11,500'. I was struggling to eat; breathing was not easy. I'd wake in the middle of the night taking deep breaths. So rather than think about it, I just went for the preventative plan: ibuprofen, Pepto-Bismol, drink a lot of water, and sleep when you can. I fought it for a few days and by day three things were pretty good. It did not keep me from hunting and since I didn't know what was happening, I didn't worry.

The hunt was a hunt. I hunted hard for the full eight plus days. The best bulls seen were on day one when Carson left me to sit on a ridge alone watching a meadow. I could tell Carson was concerned as we got to know each other bit by bit. His opening question was, "What kind of bull are you looking for?" My answer was simple, I have been on elk hunts before and not had a chance at a bull. I was willing to take a legal bull if it offered a shot. I wanted an elk. To which he smiled and said, "We will get along just fine then. Hunting has been hard this year, never seen it where the bulls quit calling and are slim pickings." So, when he left me sitting watching that meadow and I saw two bulls he was surprised.

I had no idea where Carson was, so I decided to make a play on the bulls alone. The problem was the snow had re-froze and became crusty. I could not get to them quietly at all. After an hour Carson came back and he was looking at me like "What are you doing over here?" I smiled and held two fingers up and pointed down. He thought I was giving him the peace symbol which caused a chuckling exchange. I whispered in-between chuckles, "NO! There are two bulls." His reaction was shock and surprise. We snuck in cow calling and they popped out and started sparing. Still over a hundred yards away with no shot with a bow. It was getting dark, so we left them hoping to find them in the morning.





No luck that next morning or the next morning after for eight mornings. But this story isn't about a big elk I shot or missed or even drew my bow on. This story is about an adventure of and an attempt to do those things. The result was something I will treasure forever and know that when I came off that mountain on that horse, cold, wet, smelly to which I learned you can only get so smelly, a beard much longer, that I can say I did it. I was like the guy from one of those old images in *Field & Stream<sup>TM</sup>* that came down off a mountain on a horse. I also met the most interesting people that put life into a different perspective for me that we all should experience.

The mornings and evenings in camp were a great time. I learned that the crew plays a game with new hunters. It is a way to measure up who they are talking and eating with - as old-timers would do. Is it someone that is overconfident and full of B.S. or is he/she the real deal, or something else? When I would beat Carson to the breakfast table each morning Bob would say, "Tony beat you again, what's up with that?" It meant I was actually wearing out or at least hanging with my guide. On the fourth morning, I was a little slower. I had been cold, hot, wet, sweaty, tired, altitude sickness, and overall, just out of my comforts of home and still adjusting. So, I said, "I'm a bit slower this morning, can we sit for one more cup of coffee and just warm up before we head out?" I knew another entire day of up and down the mountains was going to be tough and that one more cup of cowboy coffee was what I needed. Bob smiled and said, "we were wondering if you were human."

This was my trip. A trip that was about can I do it? I began to hear stories of people before me coming into camp and having them pack them back out after a day or two. One guy left after one afternoon hunt with Carson. I wasn't one of those guys; I could do a hard trip like this and not die, not quit and not wish I was home. You see, Kate has rules for me if I end up on a survivor show and always tells me,

"If you ever go on one of those shows; you would do well as you do not mind being alone. You will suck if you don't have shoes but if you got shoes and a bow you would do ok. Just do not, under any circumstance ever, cry on national television saying how much you miss me as that is no excuse to give up and come home!"

I may have had these words playing in my

mind on day 7 as I climbed over 6000 vertical feet in one direction to a little place called Airplane Mountain. We left before dawn and came back well after dark. As it is 6000 vertical feet to get back as well because what you do in one direction, you have to do back the other. I did it. The Garmin was measured in case you think I mismeasured it. We never saw an elk, but I did see a blue grouse. Something I have never seen before. I also saw the airplane wreckage from the 1960s that still is hanging in the trees and is scattered all over that ridge. Amazing and creepy site.

This story is about life and my new friend Frank. He is 86-years-old and still goes to camp every year. He stopped hunting at 85 after his last elk. Now he gets up and has breakfast, tells a story, warms up then goes back to bed. He meets us for dinner where he loves to hear about every detail of how we did, where we went and what we saw. He was such an inspiration to how living life is what it's all about. Get out there, do it, don't stop. Go slower if you need to, but don't stop until God says, "that's enough."

This story was a *Field & Stream™* magazine article. These guys don't have houses. They live in this camp and then leave camp to go live in Alaska and fish the rest of the year. Maybe stop at their parents' place or rent something for a month or so in-between but more or less lived as nomads hunting and fishing while getting paid. They were happy with this life and did not understand why I had to go back to work and live a completely different kind of life. There is something too simple and less complicated.

As I write this and reminisce, I remember my burning lungs of climbing up the mountains, the smell of the campfire each night, the great food we ate (fish, burgers, chicken), the canvas tent smell and sounds of the night, the fox that ran in my tent one night, the mountain lion kill 150 yards away of a small mule deer, the Shiras moose we called in for fun one evening and the overall camaraderie. Life is short, live it. It wasn't the harvest of delicious elk meat but the feeling of success that I gave it all I had.
